## PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

### LSU Law Center Professor of Law, July 2021-Present

### LSU President, January 1, 2020 (originally Interim President but retroactively named President in May, 2021)

Responsible for leading the eight members of the LSU Family and for leading the Flagship campus in Baton Rouge. All accomplishments are the result of great teamwork: I have been surrounded by fabulous people throughout my career.

Particular areas of focus:

- Pandemic
  - COVID-19 preparation, planning and implementation
    - Pivoted the entire family of LSU campuses to online learning in two weeks;
    - Coordinated all eight campuses through their response, testing, and vaccination plans;
    - Regularly met with state and federal officials to leverage assets and resource requests, and to keep them aware of LSU's significant role in the fight against COVID; and
    - LSU led the state in testing, treating and researching COVID.
- Collaboration
  - Facilitated greater collaboration among the eight LSU institutions;
  - Worked together on moving on-line; testing, and vaccination plans.
- Diversity, Equity & Inclusion
  - Brought together a talented group of diverse faculty, staff, and students for regular conversations with administration to ensure that all voices are being heard;
  - Implemented Diversity Roadmap that provides the university with purpose and direction in terms maintaining momentum of such efforts.
