Professor Keith Hall spoke on "Reconciling Property Rights with Carbon Capture and Storage" at a Contemporary Issues in Property Law Symposium at Belmont Law School in Nashville, Tennessee on Friday, September 30, 2022. Professor Hall also spoke during September on the topic of Mineral Rights at LSU's Recent Development CLE Series in Lake Charles and Baton Rouge. Also, he was recently appointed to a three-year term on Budget Committee of the Foundation for Natural Resources and Energy Law (FNREL) and to a four-year term on FNREL's Financial Advisory Committee.

Training Notice

Power-based Violence Prevention and Response: Due September 30, 2022

The mandatory training on power-based violence prevention and response is now available. All employees including faculty, staff, and graduate assistants are required to take this online training annually through Moodle. This year's hour-long course was developed by the Board of Regents and the Office of Civil Rights & Title IX, in partnership with the Office of Human Resource Management. You can access the 2022 Power-Based Violence Prevention & Response Training through your Moodle account, or you can visit the <u>mandatory employee training page</u> to view all mandatory trainings.

Louisiana state law now requires all public institutions of higher education to report the number of employees who have completed the training to the Board of Regents and the Louisiana legislature. Since the report is due in early October, to meet this compliance demand, please complete the training by midnight on Sept. 30, 2022.
